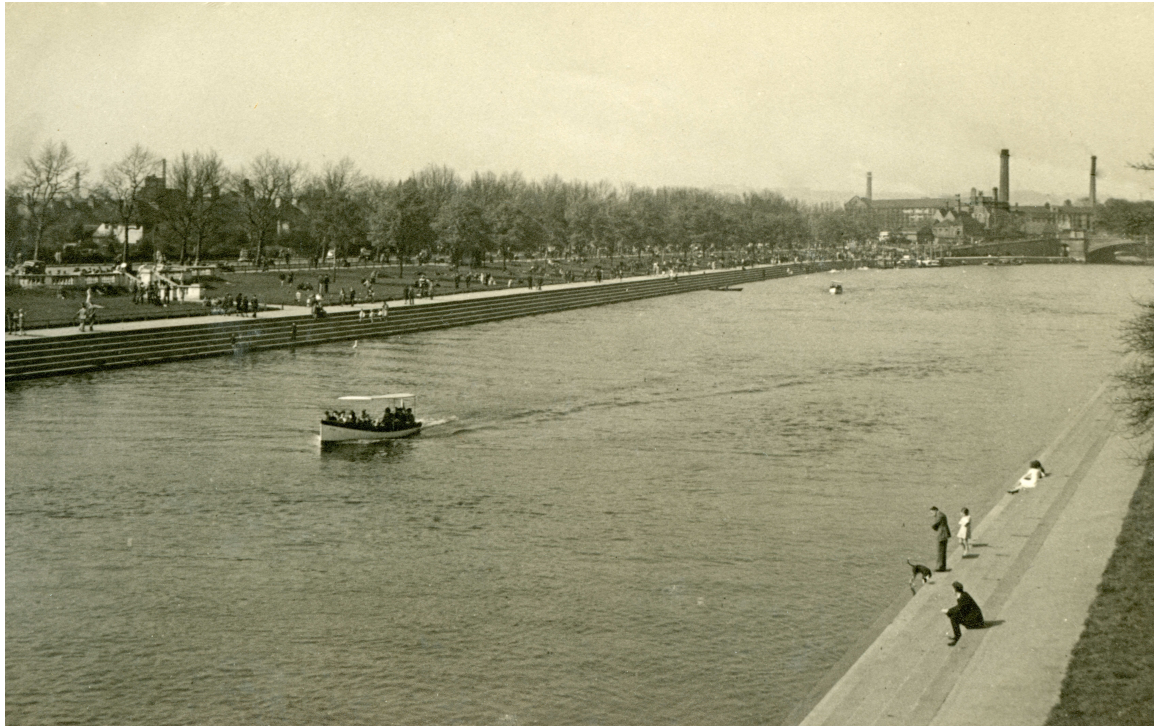

Subject: Trent Embankment. The picture appears to have been taken from the Bridgford side of the Wilford Suspension Bridge. I dated the picture as 1925 simply by association with other pictures from my Grandad's collection. The foundation stone of War Memorial was laid in 1923 and memorial completed in 1927. I can't see the triumphal arch and gateway in the picture but the steps down to the riverside are in place. This suggests to me that my guessed date is not far out. The quite lengthy shadows show the sun to be going down in the west so it would appear to be quite late in the afternoon. The number of people promenading and enjoying boat trips does suggest a Sunday or possibly a Saturday afternoon as at other times most people would have been at work. Pictures of the embankment on bank holidays that I have seen, have much larger crowds present, although it could be late in the afternoon when many have made their way home. I have plumbed for Sunday 29th June at 4.15pm.
