Rahel wanted to go back to Matlock to go shopping today as she had ambitions to buy Joseph a birthday present. Our experience of the paucity of Matlock's shops on Sunday made me suspect that it would be a rather forlorn exercise but as I knew our exit from Gilderoy would be unlikely to occur before midday I decided I could fit in a lone perambulation around the local roads below the Heights of Abraham.

I started by walking up to Upperwood in the hope of seeing the old couple we had met the day before, as I wanted to photograph them and was kicking myself that I had not had the bottle to suggest it to them at the time. There was no sign of them in the garden and I hadn't the courage to knock on the door so I contented myself with some more attempts to capture the incredible steepness of the road.

I then walked down to Masson Road. About half way up the road there was a small lorry blocking the way and a team of workers in high vis vests. "Hang on a minute" one of them said, "we're putting in a picture window for you." I was puzzled for a moment, then I saw that a section of the wall to the right of the road had been taken down. Through the gap was a good view across the Derwent Valley.

I walked on to the end of Masson Road and took some pictures of a strange collection of stones, gnarled roots, feathers, skulls and skeletons decorating part of the wall. I have seen since, on the inter web, that these might be a part of Hoodoo, animal magic or ancestor worship.

As I returned to Gilderoy I was able to get some goodish shots of Gilderoy East over the roadside wall. The fence was much as it appeared in what I assume are Grandad Fulford's photographs. There was bench under the window in the same place as in those pictures from the 1920s, although not, I think, the same one.

We drove into Matlock and parked at what claimed to be a charity car park and that I had spotted on the previous Sunday. Paying for parking was a marathon task. Panicked by signs saying I had only ten minutes to purchase a ticket showing the registration number of my car before substantial fines would be incurred, I ran around the site trying to find a machine that would accept either cash or card. All such machines were defunct. I found a signboard that had instructions for registering with a car parking application of which I'd previously not heard. The process involved making a small payment from my bank account that then had to be approved on line before the application would allow the registration to be approved. The process was very long winded and rather stuttering as the dial-up internet connection was not great. Nearly half an hour had elapsed before the process was complete. I would have bolted for another car park but given the ten minute limit and the obvious presence of number plate recognition technology, I thought that would be too risky. In the event, only the parking charge was deducted after we left.

Rahel went in search of shops and a present while I took pictures for the next U3A photography project. These were of the bridge which was closed to road traffic for repairs. I was approached by a chap who wanted to chat and for me to take pictures of his friend coming out of a café. We talked for some while covering a number of topics, including the unexpected occurrence of both death and life changing illnesses and accidents. He told a particularly poignant story of a very long term friend of his who had fallen, cracked his head and lost the ability to walk without assistance or fully communicate. I regaled him with tales of dead friends and particularly of Dermot who had unexpectedly dropped dead in August. Oh what camaraderie.

I went to Lloyd's bank to draw some money from the cash machine. While by the cash machine I put away my camera equipment. I then went to the "Original Factory Shop" in Firs Parade, where, after selecting a pair of shoes (£20) and a T shirt, I discovered that I had not taken the money from the hole in the wall machine. I think I may have had some kind of aneurysm and I remain mortified to this day.




